I appoint Thomas M. Coffey of Cookstown in the County of Tyrone Merchant and Patrick Connolly of Killybaskey in the County of Londonderry, Farmer to be the Executors of this my Will. I direct my Executors to pay my lawful debts, funeral and testamentary expenses. I give and bequeath
bequeath to the Catholic Curate for the time being at the date of my death of the Parish of Lissan the sum of five pounds sterling for the celebration of masses in public in Ireland for the repose of my soul. I give and bequeath to the said Patrick Connolly the sum of thirty pounds stg. I give and bequeath to each of the following persons the sum of ten pounds stg viz:- Hanna Connolly, Margaret Connolly, Bernard O'Kane, Catherine O'Kane all of Killybaskey, aforesaid, Maria Loughran Nancy Loughran both of Ballygruby in the County of Londonderry and Thomas Loughran of Ballygawley, in the County of Tyrone. I give and bequeath the sum of five pounds stg to each of the following persons viz. Anne Jane Quinn and Catherine Kane both of Cookstown aforesaid. I give and bequeath the rest and residue of my estate in equal shares- share and share alike- to the said Patrick Connolly Hannah Connolly, Margaret Connolly, Bernard O'Kane, Catherine O'Kane, Maria Loughran, Nancy Loughran, Thomas Loughran, Anne Jane Quinn and Catherine Kane.
