

Newton N.J. Sept 26th 1907.

I Charles Herzog of Ocean Grove in the State of New Jersey, do make this writing as and for my last Will and testament in manner following:

Item, I give and bequeath to the Trust Company of Easton Pennsylvania, the Sum of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars in trust to invest the Principal thereof, and keep the same invested, and to apply the Income therefrom when and as received towards the keeping of my Burial lot number 738 Section E. of the Easton Cemetery, in good order and repair forever, the restoration of monuments, tombstones and railings, the Said Trust Company to be answerable to the Easton Cemetery Co. for a faithful performance with the Condition of their Trust.

Item, I give and bequeath unto each of the Two Children of my Neice Emma Carney of Easton Pennsylvania, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars absolutely.

Item I give and bequeath unto my nephews, Charles and William Ashenbach, Sons of Charles Ashenbach late of Shartlesville.

Berks County Pa. the sum of Five Hundred Dollars Each, absolutely.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Nephew Daniel Herzog, Son of Daniel Herzog, Sr. of Washington D. C. the sum of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars absolutely.

Item, I give and bequeath unto each of my ^{two} Grand Neices and my Grandnephew, Amy Mable and Emerson Aschenbach Son and daughter of Oscar Aschenbach of Reading Pennsylvania the sum of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars absolutely.

Item, I give and bequeath to the Union Trust Company of Philadelphia Pennsylvania the sum of Two Thousand Dollars in trust to invest the Principal thereof and keep the same invested and to pay the income therefrom when and as received, in equal parts to the Trustees of the First Methodist Episcopal Church of Abbury Park, New Jersey and the Saint Pauls Methodist Episcopal Church of Ocean Grove New Jersey the said income to be expended for the benefit of the Poor and needy of the aforesaid Churches.

Item, I give and bequeath to the Union Trust Company of Philadelphia, Pa the sum of Five Hundred Dollars in trust to invest the principal thereof and keep the same invested, and to pay the income therefrom when and as received to the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Hospital of Philadelphia, Pa for the use of the same in Helping to maintain Said Hospital.

Item, I give and bequeath to the Union Trust Company of Philadelphia Pa, the sum of One Thousand Dollars in Trust, to invest the principal thereof, and to keep the same invested, and to pay the income therefrom, to the Trustees of the Nazarene Home for the aged, of Philadelphia, Pa. for the use of the same in helping to Maintain Said Home

Item, All the rest, residue and remainder of my Estate, Real, Personal and Mixed wheresoever and whatsoever, I give, devise and bequeath unto the said the Nazarene Home for the Aged, of the City of Philadelphia, Pa. its successors and assigns absolutely forever.

Item, I authorize and empower my executor hereinafter named to have erected in my burial lot in the Easton Cemetery a monument at a cost of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars, I also authorize and empower my executor to seal and dispose of all my Real Estate and personal property for the payment of my debts, the settlement and distribution of my estate, or for any other purpose, and for the sufficient deed or deeds therefore to make, make seal and deliver to the purchaser or Purchasers thereof and without any liability on

the part of such Purchasers to see to or be answerable for the application of the Purchase Moneys, and free clear and discharged from the lien of the Legacies herein given.

Item, It is my Desire, Wish and Instruction, that if any person or persons named named in this my last will and testament, Should attempt to have the same altered or broken in any way that then the Item relating ^{to} that person or persons Shall become void, and they Shall not receive any thing whatsoever.

Lastly, I nominate, Constitute and appoint my friend Rev. Richard W. Sutcliffe, of Philadelphia, Pa. to be the executor of this my last Will and testament, for which Service I give and bequeath unto him the sum of Two Hundred and fifty Dollars, in lieu of any commissions to which he might be entitled to receive as such executors hereby revoking all Wills by me at any time heretofore made.
