Know all Men by these Presents, That we Guarantee Trust Company, a corporation of the State of New Jersey of the City of Atlantic City, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, are held and firmly bound unto the Ordinary or Surrogate General of the said State of New Jersey in the sum of Eight Thousand (\$8,000) Dollars lawful money of the United States to be paid unto the said The Ordinary or Surrogate General as aforesaid, his successors or assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Dealed with our seals and dated the Twenty-first day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eight (1908). The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden Guarantee Trust Company administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of Elmer M. Packard, deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Guarantee Trust Company, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said Guarantee Trust Company, and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the registry of the Prerogative Court in the Secretary's office of this State, or into the Surrogate's office of the County of Atlantic, at or before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the above written obligation, and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time of his death which at any time after shall come into the hands or possession of the said Guarantee Trust Company, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said Guarantee Trust Company do well and truly administer according to law; and further do make or cause to be made a just and true account of its administration within twelve calendar months from the date of the above written obligation; and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judges of the Orphans Court of the County, or other competent authority, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as is or are or shall by law be entitled to receive the same; and if it shall hereafter appear that any last will or testament was made by the said deceased, and the executor or executors therein named, or any other person or persons do exhibit the same into the said Prerogative Court or the Surrogate's office of the County of Atlantic, making a request to have it allowed and approved, if the said Guarantee Trust Company being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said letters of administration (approval of such testament being first had and made by the said court, then the above obligation to be void and of no effect or else to remain in full force and virtue sealed and delivered in) Guarantee Trust Company
