

In the matter of the Estate of Pauline Minerad dec'd } Bond

Know all men by these presents, that we Walter H. Minerad, Walter J. McDevitt and Thomas D. McDevitt, of Atlantic City, New Jersey, are held and firmly bound unto the Ordinary or Surrogate General of the State of New Jersey in the sum of fifteen thousand dollars lawful money of the United States, to be paid unto the said Ordinary, his successors or assigns to which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally, firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the Twentieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine (1909).

The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden Walter H. Minerad Administrators of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of Pauline Minerad deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Walter H. Minerad, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said Walter H. Minerad and the same so made, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the registry of the Prerogative Court in the Secretary's office of this State, or into the surrogate's office of the County of Atlantic, at or before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of the above written obligation, and the same goods, chattels, and credits and all other goods, chattels, and credits of the said deceased at the time of her death which, at any time, after shall come into the hands or possession of the said Walter H. Minerad or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for the said Walter H. Minerad, do well and truly administer according to law and the provisions of the said will, and further, do make or cause to be made a just and true account of his administration within twelve calendar months from the date of the above written obligation and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels, and credits which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judges of the Orphans' Court of the said County, or other competent authority, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as is, are, or shall by law and the provisions of said will be entitled to receive the same, then the said obligation to be void and of no effect; or else to remain in full force and virtue.
