Your petitioner John J. Brandall respectfully shows that one Louis Kumpf departed this life on or about the Twenty fourth day of July A. D. 1901 in the County of Atlantic after making his last will and testament in due form of law and creating Charles A. Baake Esq. Executor thereof who has proved said will and assumed and is now in the active administration of such trust and petitioner further shows that this Court about one year ago ordered said executor to pay petitioner out of the moneys of said Estate the sum of Two hundred dollars as for proctors fees for services in the contest of the exceptions filed by the widow of deceased to said executors account and that said executor refuses to pay said sum save and except the sum of twenty dollars which petitioner has received on account of such sum of Two hundred dollars leaving a balance of one hundred and eighty dollars which said executor refuses to pay over to petitioner although often demanded.
