

Atlantic County Orphans Court.

In the matter of the Estate of Herman Doernbach, deceased, alleged to be insolvent. } On application of Administrator Report of sale of land by Administrator.

In pursuance of an order of this Court made in the above matter on the Eleventh day of July, 1905, directing the subscriber, the administrator of Herman Doernbach, deceased, to sell certain lands of said deceased in the said order particularly designated and described, I do hereby report that I did give notice that the said lands and premises would be exposed to sale at public vendue on the Eighth day of August, 1905 at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon, upon the said premises, by public notices signed by myself and set up at five or more public places in the County of Atlantic, one whereof was in the City of Egg Harbor City, in which the said real estate is situated, at least four weeks before the time appointed for selling the same, and also by publishing said notice in the Main Landing Record and the Deutscher Herald, two of the newspapers printed and published in the said County of Atlantic, in which the said real estate is situated, of which one was a newspaper published in Main Landing, the County-seat of said County of Atlantic, for four weeks successively, once in each week next preceding the time appointed for said sale. And I further report that at the time and place so appointed and advertised I did expose the said lands and premises to sale at public vendue, to the highest bidder, and Katharine Quetsch then and there bidding for the same the sum of Three Hundred and twenty-four Dollars and twenty cents over and above the existing encumbrances, and no one else bidding so much or more, for the same, the said tract of lands and premises, was thereupon struck off and sold by me to the said Katharine Quetsch at the price aforesaid.

Upon reading and filing a report, bearing date on the seven-

teenth day of August, A.D. nineteen hundred and five made in the above stated matter, by Christian City, administrator of the Estate of Herman Doernbach, deceased, of the sale of lands made by said administrator pursuant to the order of this Court made on the Eleventh day of July, nineteen hundred and five, from which report it appears that the said administrator duly advertised the time and place of said sale according to law, and did at the time and place so advertised sell the same by public vendue to the highest bidder; that Katharine Quetsch bidding therefor the sum of Three Hundred and Twenty-four Dollars and Twenty cents over and above the existing encumbrances, and being the highest bidder for the same, that the said premises were then and there struck off and sold to the said Katharine Quetsch and no cause being shown or appearing against confirming the said sale.
