Matthews, now Eliza M. Howe, as aforesaid, the interest of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, hereinabove set forth, is unprotected and in jeopardy. Your petitioner therefore prays, on behalf of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, as aforesaid, that this Honorable Court may revoke the Letters of Administration heretofore granted to the said Eliza A. Matthews, now Eliza M. Howe, as aforesaid, and remove her from office.

Order To Show Cause.

Application having been made to this Court by George W. Stone, acting for and on behalf of the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, by petition setting forth under oath 1. That the Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America is entitled to a beneficial interest in the estate of James A. Matthews, deceased, late of the Town of Hammonton, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey; 2. That Eliza A. Matthews, now Eliza M. Howe, the Administratrix cum testamento annexo appointed upon said estate, has removed her residence out of the State of New Jersey, and now resides in the Township of Orwell, in the County of Bradford and State of Pennsylvania, and neglects and refuses to proceed with the administration of said estate and to execute and perform the duties and trusts devolving upon her as the Administratrix of said estate; 3. That the said Administratrix has become and still is of unsound mind and mentally incapacitated for the transaction of business; and 4. That by reason of such removal of residence, neglect, refusal, unsoundness of mind and mental incapacity of said ad-

ministratrix, the interests of said Board of Foreign Missions of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America are unprotected and in jeopardy; It is Thereupon, on this Twenty Third day of October, nineteen hundred and five, Ordered, that the said Eliza A. Matthews, or Eliza M. Howe the Administratrix of the said estate, shall show cause before this Court on the Seventh day of November, Nineteen hundred and five, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, at the Court House at Mays Landing, why she should not be removed from her said office of Administratrix. It be Further Ordered, that notice of the granting of this order shall be given to the said Administratrix by serving upon her personally, a copy of the same, together with a copy of the petition upon which the same is granted, both of which copies may be uncertified, at least ten days before the return day of this order.
