In the matter of the estate of Aaron Rahmin deceased

The account of the executor of the estate of Aaron Rahmin, deceased, having been duly audited and stated by the surrogate and allowed by this court and it appearing by the said account that the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred and Sixty Four Dollars and Eighty cents, remains after payment of debts and just expenses, and it having been proved to the satisfaction of the court that the said Aaron Rahmin, left six sons, two daughters and seven children to wit, Elizabeth Rahmin, Arnold Rahmin, Phillip Rahmin, Victoria Rahmin, Willie Rahmin, Peter Rahmin and Emma Rahmin, his surviving and his only next of kin.

It is therefore on this 30th day of November, Nineteen hundred and nine, ordered, adjudged, and decreed that the above said sum be distributed and paid to the above said widow and next of kin of the said Aaron Rahmin, as follows, to wit: One third part thereof amounting to the sum of Three Hundred and Sixty Four Dollars and Sixty cents to Rosa Rahmin the widow of the said Aaron Rahmin and the remaining two thirds equally between the seven children, in the following manner, to wit, One hundred and four dollars (104.21) and twenty seven cents to Elizabeth Rahmin, and the same sum One hundred and four (104.21) and twenty seven cents to the guardians of each and every one of the remaining children, namely, Arnold Rahmin, Phillip Rahmin, Victoria Rahmin, Willie Rahmin, Peter Rahmin and Emma Rahmin.

In the matter of the estate of Louise Beck deceased

The petition of William H. Beck respectfully shows, that on the eleventh day of June nineteen hundred and eight, he was duly appointed by the surrogate of the county of Atlantic the executor of the estate of Louise Beck deceased, and your petitioner further shows, that he has discovered and believes that the personal estate of his aforesaid testator is insufficient to pay her debts, and that he hereby exhibits under oath a true account of the personal estate and debts of his said testator, so far as he can discover the same, which account is hereto annexed.

And your petitioner further shows, that the said Louise Beck did own of a certain tract of land, situate in the city of Egg Harbor City, in the county of Atlantic and stated New Jersey, to wit:

Buildings lot No 5 and 3 in Block No 55, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the southeast side of Saint Louis avenue, the hundred feet northwesterly by a gas street thence running northwesterly along the said side of the said avenue, two hundred feet and extending in length or breadth south easterly, one hundred and fifty feet, being the said breadth in parallel lines and at right angles with the said avenue, to the northwest side of a back street, containing thirty thousand square feet

That the said land consists of two vacant building lots adjoining and comprising one tract of land, and that the same as near as your petitioner can ascertain is valued at about four hundred dollars.

Your petitioner therefore requests the aid of the court in the premises and prays that an order may be made in manner and form as required by law, requiring all persons interested in such lands, tenements, hereditaments and real estate to appear before this court, to show cause why so much of the above described lands, tenements, hereditaments and real estate of the said Louise Beck did seized as aforesaid, should not be sold as will be sufficient to pay the residue of the debts of said deceased.
