This matter being opened to the Court by Gilbert J. Woodruff, Proctor of Petitioners, and it appearing by the petition filed herein that Charles Haushalter, deceased, late of the town of Pleasantville, County of Atlantic, and State of New Jersey, died on the eighth day of December, A. D. nineteen hundred and five leaving a last will and testament, wherein he appointed his wife, Elizabeth Haushalter, to be the sole executrix thereof, that said will devised and bequeathed all of decedent's estate to his said wife for life and after her death to their respective heirs absolutely, that said will was duly proven before the surrogate of the County of Atlantic, December twenty ninth, A. D. nineteen hundred and five, duly recorded, probate awarded and letters testamentary issued to said administratrix; and that the said Elizabeth Haushalter, did January twelfth A. D. nineteen hundred and thirteen, after having taken upon herself the burden of administration, and enjoying said estate leaving property and assets of said estate unadministered; that the said Charles Haushalter, deceased, was survived by Charles Haushalter, the petitioner, the only child of his deceased brother, and Emma, George, Mary and Frederick Haushalter, Annie Beauty and Bertha Haushalter, all children of another deceased brother, Percy Haushalter; that the said Charles Haushalter is the only next of kin residing in the United States, and that the exact post office addresses and residences of the several next of kin in Germany are unknown with the exception of the eldest, viz., Emma Haushalter who resides at Buchsweiler, K. D. nineteen hundred and thirteen, ordered that the named parties in interest show cause before this Court at Mayor's Gardens, New Jersey, on the last Thursday in June, 1913 at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon why letters of administration on the above estate should not issue to Le Roy Ayres, of Camden, New Jersey, in accordance with the prayer of the petition filed.

And it is further ordered that notice to the parties in interest be given according to the statute and duly governing practice to absent defendant in the Court of Chancery; that publication be made in Atlantic Review and News concerning the same and that the notice mailed to those whose post office address is known contain a request that the other parties in interest giving names, be notified by them.
