

Deponent further says, that particularly is it true that Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita died on the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen; that the circumstances surrounding the death of said Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita are as follows:

That on or about fourteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and fourteen, said Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita being in poor health and being afflicted with tuberculosis, journeyed to Europe for the benefit of his health and in an endeavor to be cured of his said disease; that while in Warsaw, Russia, on said twenty-fifth day of November, said Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita departed this life, his death being caused so far as deponent is advised and verily believes, from said disease of tuberculosis; that deponent was present at the funeral services held over the remains of said Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita.

Upon reading and filing the duly verified petition of Pauline Blinden, and it appearing to my satisfaction that Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita was a resident of the County of Atlantic and died on or about November 25, 1914, in Warsaw, Russia, possessed of personal property of the value of \$1027.46, as near as can be ascertained, and that his next of kin and heirs have neglected for more than forty days from his death to apply for letters of administration upon his estate:

It is, on this twenty-fourth day of February, nineteen hundred and fifteen, ordered that the brothers and sisters of said Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita, deceased, and all persons in interest do now cause before this Court, on Wednesday, the 31 day of March 1915, at Court House May's Landing, New Jersey at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, why letters of administration upon the estate of said Stanislavovitch Konstanty Emielita Deceased should not be granted to Pauline Blinden or some other fit person; and
