I, Carindo Pardi, aged 37 years, occupation laborer, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color white, complexion dark, height 5 feet 5 inches, weight 150 pounds, color of hair black, color of eyes brown, other visible distinctive marks none.

I was born in Abbruzzi Italy on the 6th day of September, anno Domini 1879; I now reside at Pomona, New Jersey

I emigrated to the United States of America from Naples, Italy on the vessel Palermo; my last foreign residence was Abbruzzi Italy

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel 3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of Boston, in the State of Mass., on or about the 26th day of July, anno Domini 1913; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein;
