Francesco Papaleo aged 39 years, occupation waiter, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color white, complexion dark, height 5 feet 10 inches, weight 155 pounds, color of hair black, color of eyes brown, other visible distinctive marks none

I was born in Catanzaro Italy on the 6th day of August, anno Domini 1878; I now reside at 164 Ocean Ave Atlantic City New Jersey

I emigrated to the United States of America from Naples Italy on the vessel Pictoria; my last foreign residence was Catanzaro Italy; I am not married; the name of my wife is ...; she was born at ... and now resides at ...

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel 3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject; I arrived at the port of New York City in the State of New York on or about the 21st day of April, anno Domini 1889; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: SO HELP ME GOD.
