occupation *laborer*, do declare on oath that my personal  
description is: Color *white*, complexion *dark*, height *5* feet *7* inches,  
weight *165* pounds, color of hair *brown*, color of eyes *brown*  
other visible distinctive marks *bald*

I was born in *Messina Italy*  
on the *11th* day of *May*, anno Domini *1876*; I now reside  
at *Hammonton, New Jersey*

I emigrated to the United States of America from *Messina Italy*  
on the vessel *Nicara* my last  
(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

foreign residence was *Messina Italy*; I am *—* married; the name  
of my wife is *Giorgina*; she was born at *Messina Italy*  
and now resides at *Hammonton, New Jersey*

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign  
prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to *Victor Emmanuel 3rd*  
*King of Italy*, of whom I am now a subject;

State of *New York*, on or about the *25th* day  
of *March*, anno Domini *1904*; I am not an anarchist; I am not a  
polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith  
to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
