I, Harry Bernick, aged 19 years, occupation driver, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color white, complexion dark, height 5 feet 4 inches, weight 139 pounds, color of hair black, color of eyes brown, other visible distinctive marks none.

I was born in Russia on the 1st day of January, anno Domini 1899; I now reside at 108 S Kentucky Ave Atlantic City New Jersey (give number, street, city or town, and State.)

I emigrated to the United States of America from Paris France on the vessel does not remember; my last foreign residence was Russia; I am not married; the name of my wife is _____; she was born at _____ and now resides at _____.

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Present governments of Russia, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of New York City in the State of New York, on or about the 15th day of November, anno Domini 1905; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: SO HELP ME GOD.
