I, Giuseppe Repisci, aged 33 years, occupation Laborer, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color White, complexion Medium, height 5 feet 2 inches, weight 150 pounds, color of hair Light Brown, color of eyes Brown, other visible distinctive marks None

I was born in Messina Italy on the 19th day of March, anno Domini 1885; I now reside at Hammonton New Jersey

I emigrated to the United States of America from Messina Italy on the vessel Verona

(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance and name of transportation company should be given) my last foreign residence was Verona Italy; I am not married; the name of my wife is Flora Repisci; she was born at Scilla Italy and now resides at Hammonton New Jersey

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel 3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of Philadelphia Pa in the State of Pennsylvania, on or about the 27th day of May, anno Domini 1904; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
