I was born in Messina Italy
on the 17th day of June, anno Domini 1887. I now reside
at Risley New Jersey

I emigrated to the United States of America from Messina Italy
on the vessel Aurena; my last

foreign residence was Messina Italy; I am married; the name
of my wife is Marie Venuto; she was born at Palermo Italy
and now resides at Risley New Jersey

3rd King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;
