I was born in Brestle Tuffe, Russia on the 25th day of July, anno Domini 1892; I now reside at 24 S. Dover Ave., Atlantic City, N.J.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Hamburg, Germany on the vessel \_\_\_\_\_; my last

foreign residence was Brestle Tuffe, Russia; I am \_\_\_\_\_ married; the name of my wife is Lohana Gotbett; she was born at Brestle Tuffe, Russia and now resides at Brestle Tuffe, Russian Poland. It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Present Government of Russia, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, on or about the 22nd day of November, anno Domini 1912; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: SO HELP ME GOD.
