I was born in Riga, Russia
on the 17th day of January, anno Domini 1883, now reside
at 331 North Vermont Ave., Atlantic City, N. J.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Hamburg, Germany
on the vessel Bluecher; my last
(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given)

foreign residence was Riga, Russia; I am married; the name
of my wife is Anna; she was born at Russian Poland

and now resides at 331 North Vermont Ave., Atlantic City, N. J.
