description is: Color white, complexion medium, height 5 feet 4 inches,
weight 138 pounds, color of hair light brown, color of eyes grey
other visible distinctive marks Mustache

I was born in Minsk Russia
on the 15th day of September, anno Domini 1877 I now reside
at 1313 Arctic Ave Atlantic City N.J.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Lebaev Russia
by the vessel Russia; my last
foreign residence was Minsk Russia; I am married; the name
of my wife is Fanny; she was born at Minsk Russia
and now resides at Minsk Russia

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign
prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Present Government
of Russia of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of New York City, in the
State of New York, on or about the 15th day
of July, anno Domini 1912; I am not an anarchist; I am
polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith
to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
