We had hoped that either one of two things would happen: Eithe that last year's experience with daylight saving hours would so disgust the people that they would forget to mention it this year, or that the order would come from Washington to set clocks ahead one hour, all over the United States. As it stands to day, it is not even unanimous in any state—it is adopted in spots, and rejected in others. It will be complicated, in Hammonton for instance, whichever method we adopt.
