Clark Acquitted By Jury In Less Than Five Minutes After Trial Lasting Only Two Hours -Peacock's Death Accidental.

Robert Clark, colored, indicted for manslaughter in connection with the death of Robert Peacock, also colored, in the saloon of Bernard Durkin, 801 Aretle Avenue, on December 28 last, was arranged for trial Wednesday last and after one of the shortest trials of this nature ever held here, acquitted by the jury after five minutes deliberation. Prosecutor C L. Goldenberg moved the case for the State and Clark was defended by William 1. Garri-

Briefly, the story of the case was that Peacock, who was bartender for Durkin, became intoxicated and Durkin relieved him behind the bar. Peacock then walked out into the room and approached Clark, who was standing against the wall. Peacock playfully necessed the latter of " ringing in drinks on him" and struck him alight blow, whereupon Clark pushed him away and Pencock fell, striking a brass railing. After that Pencock went to another sulcon and had several drinks returning to his home. The next day he was where he died from internal hemorrhage caused by a broken artery. Beveral ribs were found broken.

Very litte time was consumed in examining witnesses and Prosecutor Goldenberg did not consider an argument to the jury necessary,

Clark's own story was as follows: "I was standing in the saloon when someone came in and asked us to have a drink. I took a glass read the paper. The saloon is the only place in the neighborhood to go to read a paper, When Peacock got through he came over to me and pushed my nose, I said 'go away, Bob, I don't want to have any trouble with you." Bob shapped me again and I pushed him away He had a habit of slapping my face and would sometimes chase me out. It was just playing. sald he was all right."
