"The bill provides that the sum of \$20 per month shall be paid to the widow of any offi-cer or enlisted man in the Army or Navy who was his lawful widow during his service, and that the rate of pension for a widow who has reached or shall bereader reach the age of 70 years shall be \$30 per month.

"It provides further that any widow whose name has been on the pension roll, and whose name has been dropped by resson of her remarriage to another person, who has sine died, shall be entitled to have her name again placed on the pension roll at the rate she was formerly pensioned, unline she is entitled to a greater amount under action 1 of the act. And this provision is extended to those widows whose husbands died of wounds, injuries or disease incurred during the period of their military or naval service, but who were de-prived of pendion under the act of March 3, 1863, because of their indulity to draw pension

by reason of their remnistings.
"The bill provides also that any widow who married a veteran soldier or satior prior to June 27, 1906, shall have title to pension, to commence from the date of filing of application, after the passage of this act. Heretofore the widow of a soldier de sailor, who married the said soldier or sailor judeoquent to 1890 was not entitled to a pension in the ent of 1808.
