Second District Congressional Convention Call.

Pursuant to the authority vested in us by the rules of the Republican Party, we hereby call upon the Republican voters of Atlantic, Burlington, Cape May and Cumberland Counties, comprising the Second Congressional District of the State of New Jersey, to elect delegates to a convention to be held at Cape May Hotel, Cape May City, N. J., on Thursday, the 15th day of September, 1910, at 12 o'clock noon, for the purpose of nominating a candidate for the House of Representatives of the United States for the Second Congressional District of New Jersey, to be voted for at the next general election to be held on November the 5th, 1910.
