

REPUBLICANS CHOOSE LEWIS FOR GOVERNOR

UNANIMOUSLY NOMINATED AT CONVENTION.

Platform Introduced by Congressman Gardner Declares For Rate-Making Law—Old-Time Party Enthusiasm.

Hon. Vivian M. Lewis of Passaic County, present Congressman, was unanimously nominated Tuesday last as the Republican candidate for Governor in one of the liveliest conventions ever held in this State.

Atlantic County, the first district called by Chairman William Bunting of the Executive Committee of the County, was the first to vote.

THE STATE PLATFORM. The Republican party, in convention assembled, heartily approves the administration of President William Howard Taft.

We commend to the people of this State the results of the labors of the Congress just adjourned, which has passed most measures which contribute to the benefit and development of the country.

We especially commend the tariff. The tariff provides for the most efficient protection of American labor; a revenue to provide for the expenses of the government.

We endorse the action of President Taft and a Republican Congress in providing an expert and impartial permanent tariff board to investigate tariff schedules.

We favor a statute giving the commission the power to fix just and reasonable rates for service rendered.

We approve the policy of conservation announced by the President, and we believe so far as it is possible, the principles which govern that policy.

We believe in the principle that an industry ought to bear the cost of personal injuries sustained by the business.

We favor the wise and beneficial development of the commerce of the State, and to the end we pledge ourselves to the continuance of the policy of the construction and maintenance of our public highways and inland waterways.

Fifteen years ago the people of this State, appalled by the widespread corruption under Democratic administration, elected the Republican party in control.

Pollsters from now on until election will be the theme of the hour. Every citizen is or ought to be interested in the selection of our National, State and County officials.

The Democratic party is doing all in its power to gain control of the National law-making body. Every Republican, regular and insurgent, who believes in Republican principles, must cross-party strike and work hand in hand for the success of those principles.

The lesson of Maine impresses upon the party throughout the country the necessity of harmony, in order that Republican representatives in the House may control the situation. The insurgent press is doing its own party great harm by full-fledged. The Democrats are eager to seize upon the slightest pretext for criticism of the party in power, regardless of its justification.

Maine has furnished another lesson, that of the futility of strict prohibition laws. The people of the state have had enough of them and are seeking relief by turning to other political powers. The turn cannot be but temporary, to be sure, for Maine has no particular love for Democratic principles and knows full well the benefits derived from the Republican administration; but the prohibition laws are irksome and the people of the state seek a more liberal government.

Congressman John J. Gardner's opponents are getting busy with their vituperative campaign of calumny and denunciation. Like the man in the fable, they are trying to tear down their neighbor's house because they cannot have one like it. Instead of working on their own merits and building one of their own, their methods are too negative, too plainly derogatory to win any commendation other than from disgruntled politicians and their doubtful following. Congressman Gardner, with his years of experience in legislation and his strong influence in the House, is eminently the most fit man in South Jersey for the office. That he will be returned there is not the slightest doubt.

That Vivian M. Lewis, Republican nominee for Governor, will be elected seems certain. His record is clean; he is a man of unquestioned integrity, probity and sincerity of purpose. He has demonstrated his ability as a public servant and is well qualified in every way to become the executive head of the commonwealth. The enthusiasm with which his name has been received throughout the State is the hearty response of the people to the candidacy of a man in whom they have every confidence, in whose ability to cope with the vexing problems that confront the incumbent of this high office they have implicit faith and who appeals to all as a frank, straightforward American.

Woodrow Wilson, the Democratic candidate for Governor, on the other hand, does not make this popular appeal to the common people. Educated he may be and intelligent as collegiate professors go; but he is not the sort of man Americans like to have at the head of their government. He is not a native of New Jersey, nor has he taken enough interest in its political affairs always to vote at the elections. As a man and as the head of a great university he is worthy of high esteem; but as gubernatorial timber he falls to measure up to popular ideals. His candidacy, too, savors too much of certain interests to commend him to the people. Frank Kentenbaugh is much more popular among the people and would have polled a larger vote; but as neither could win out against Vivian M. Lewis that is of small consequence.
