SHERIFF'S SALE.

By virtue of a writ of fieri facias, to me directed, issued out of the New Jersey Court of Chancery, will be sold at public vendue, on SATURDAY, THE TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF DECEMBER, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND TEN, at two o'clock in the afternoon of said day, at Kuehnle's Hotel, corner Atlantic and South Carolina Avenues, in the City of Atlantic City, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, all that certain tract or parcel of land and premises hereinafter particularly described, situate in the City of Atlantic City, in the County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey, beginning at a point in the Northernly line of Pacific Avenue at the distance of one hundred and sixty-five feet Eastwardly from the Northernly corner of Arkansas and Pacific Avenues, and running thence (1st) Westwardly along the Northernly side of said Pacific Avenue forty-five feet; thence (2nd) Northwardly on a line parallel with said Pacific Avenue one hundred and ten feet; thence (3rd) Westwardly on a line parallel with said Pacific Avenue twenty feet; thence (4th) Northwardly on a line parallel with said Arkansas Avenue thirty feet; thence (5th) Eastwardly on a line parallel with said Pacific Avenue sixty-five feet to the Westernly line of a twenty feet wide alley leading Northwardly into said Pacific Avenue, thence (6th) Southwardly along the Westernly line of said alley one hundred and forty feet to the place of beginning.

Few Changes in Game Laws.

Few changes in the seasons for game are noted in the next little pamphlet of New Jersey Fish and Game Laws that is being distributed among sportsmen. The open seasons are as follows:
Quail, partridge, grouse, English or ring-necked pheasant, squirrel, rabbit, wild turkey and woodcock, November 15 to December 31.
Coveys, English or Wilson snipe, March 1 to April 30; September 1 to December 31.
Habitat, marsh hen or mud hen and red bird, September 1 to December 31.
Fur seal, August 1 to September 30.
Black and Mallard ducks, January 1 to March 1; November 1 to December 31.
Wood ducks, closed season until April 1, 1911.
All other ducks and swan, except black mallard, wood and sheldrake, January 1 to March 31; November 1 to December 31.
Goose, brant and sheldrake, January 1 to April 30.
Brook trout, April 1 to July 15.
Crappie, calico bass, black bass, perch and white bass, May 20 to November 30.
Pike and pickerel, January 1 to May 20 to November 30.
Shore birds, surf and bay snipe, May 1 to December 31.
Deer may be killed only every Wednesday in November.

Notice of Fire Alarms.

The fire whistle is to be blown for fire alarm only. The alarm signals are as follows:
1 short blast, North of Fire Station;
2 short blasts, East of Fire Station;
3 short blasts, South of Fire Station;
4 short blasts, West of Fire Station.
All blasts are to be preceded with one long blast as an alarm of fire. In blowing the alarm the first blast must be made carefully in order to prevent damage to the whistle.
