XIII The balance of ten thousand dollars unto my twelve nieces and nephews, to wit: James H. Carlin, George A. Carlin, Walter Carlin, Philip Carlin, Harry Barry, Frederick T. Barry, Walter Barry, John Barry, Emily Simons, Mary E. Logue, Unetta Agnes Murry, and Mabel Elizabeth ^{Benson} ~~Murry~~ share and share alike, to have and to hold the same to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

d. I give and bequeath unto my nephews James H. Carlin, George A. Carlin, Walter Carlin, Harry Barry and Frederick T. Barry, and unto my niece Emily M. Simon, all of the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, each the sum of three hundred dollars to have and to hold unto them and their heirs and assigns forever.

e. I give and bequeath unto my nephews Walter Barry, John Barry and Philip Carlin, and unto my niece Mary E. Logue, all of the said City of Philadelphia, each the sum of two hundred dollars to have and to hold the same to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

f. I give and bequeath unto my nieces Unetta Agnes Murry, and Mabel Elizabeth Benson, of Atlantic City aforesaid each the sum of one thousand dollars, to have and to hold to them and their heirs and assigns forever.

g. I give and bequeath unto my cousin, Mary Quigg, of Philadelphia, Pa., the sum of three hundred dollars, to have and to hold to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

h. I give and bequeath unto the Archbishop of the Catholic Church in Philadelphia, Pa., the sum of four hundred dollars to be used by him for the purpose of caring for my burial lot in the Old Cathedral Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa.,

i. I desire that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of the balance of this fund and if anything shall remain thereafter then I give and bequeath the same in equal shares unto Assumption Dorcas Association of 12th & Spring Garden Streets, Philadelphia, Pa. in memory of Eleanor Barry, unto St. Vincent de Paul Society of said Church ~~and unto St. Vincent de Paul Society of said Church and unto~~ ^{and unto} St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Augustine Church at 4th & Race Streets, Philadelphia, Pa.

2. I give and bequeath unto my said niece Mary Regina Sheahan all my jewelry, furniture, clothes, paintings, moneys in bank, or in my possession at the time of my decease. All interest due me to grow due on the contract for the sale of the properties at the corner of St. James Place and Pacific Avenue, aforesaid, or any evidence of debt token thereunder, and all other goods, chattels, and personal property not herein specifically bequeathed to have and to hold the same unto her and her heirs and assigns forever.

I suggest and desire that my said niece use the income derived from the said shares for such charitable purposes as I have outlined to her during my life.

5. I nominate constitute and appoint my said niece Mary Regina Sheahan, to be Executrix of this will, expressly stating that she shall not be required to give bond for the

For the performance of the duties of such office.

6. I authorize, empower and direct my said executrix to make, private or public sale of all of ^{my} real estate and to give good and sufficient deeds therefor to the purchaser or purchasers as well as to the purchaser, or his assigns, under any contract which I may have made during my life time.

7. In the event of a default by the purchaser of my said real estate at the corner of St. James Place and Pacific Avenue, it is my will, and I do direct my said executrix to sell and dispose of the same to the end that the proceeds of such sale may be used to discharge the legacies herein before set forth.
