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prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to George 5th King of Great Britain and Ireland, of whom I am now a subject; I arrived at the port of Boston, in the State of Mass., on or about the 3rd day of June, anno Domini 1913; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: SO HELP ME GOD.
