Hammonton's pioneer merchant, George Elvins, died on Tuesday morning, February 6th, at his home on Bellevue Avenue at Main Road, aged 85 years.

Altho' not in robust health for several years, Mr. Elvins had continued to manage their large grocery and feed business, making weekly trips to the city.

Few men in the history of Hammonton have made themselves felt for real Christian acts as did Mr. Elvins. For this he was beloved by all, of every creed and race. As a friend, business man, and director in financial circles, his advice was eagerly sought, freely given and found to be sound. Hundreds of successful young men owe their success to the advice given them in early life by Mr. Elvins.

Mr. Elvins came here about 1858, and engaged in business a few years later. For several years he served his constituents faithfully as Member of the Assembly; and for a number of years was Hammonton's able postmaster.

To the sons and daughters who are thus bereft of a kind and loving father, we extend sympathy of one who has passed thru the same sorrow; and to Mrs. Crowell, who has laid away both husband and father, we wish especially to offer our sympathies.

Funeral service was held at the late residence of the deceased, yesterday afternoon, conducted by his pastor, Rev. G. H. Keller. The beautiful floral offerings were but a manifestation of the great love that people had for one who had proved himself a friend indeed.

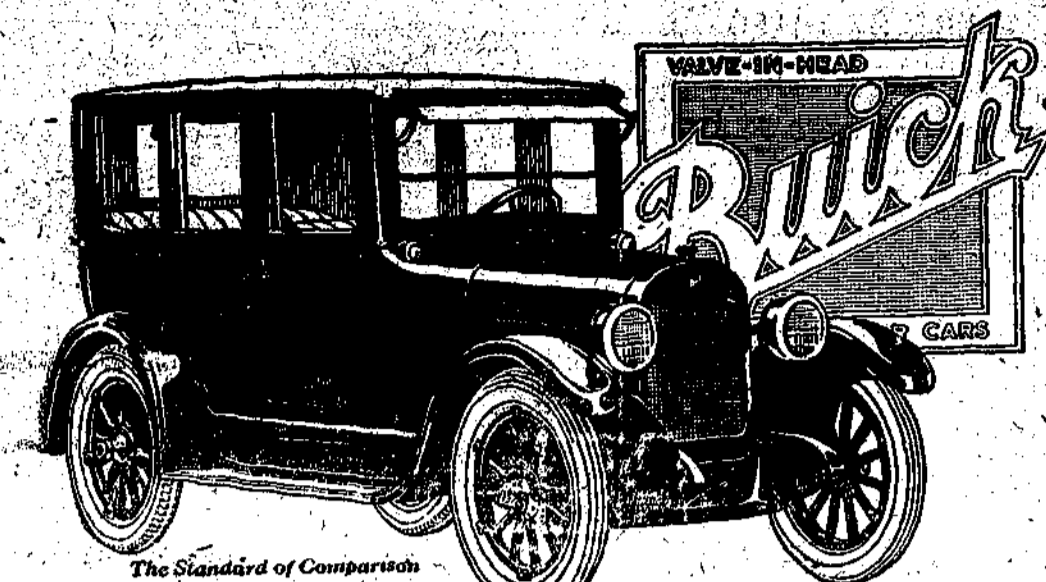
