For a man who wrote more than 200 novels, Scott was not a prolific writer. He wrote only 18 novels, but they are among the most popular of all time.

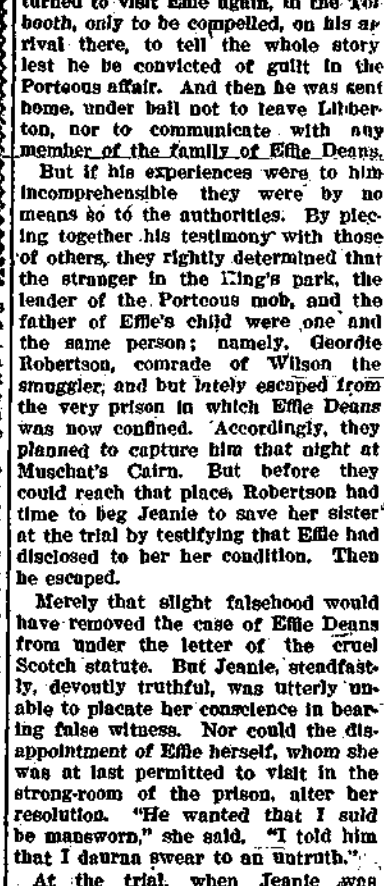
