Another Week of Fires.

Up to going to press, there were six fires reported the past week.

Two were on Saturday afternoon.

Treasurer, Clerk and Solicitor were authorized to proceed with details relative to sale of bonds.

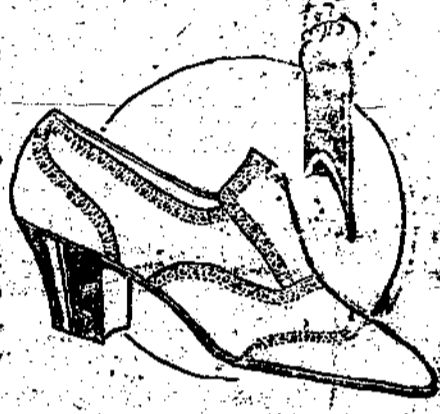

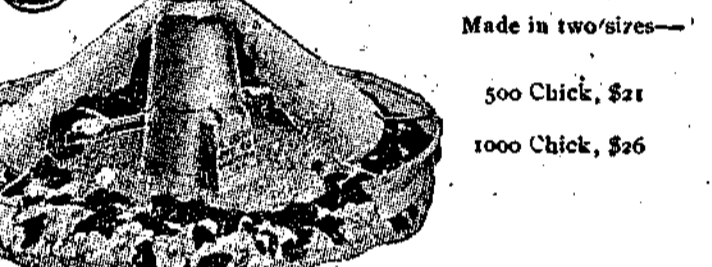

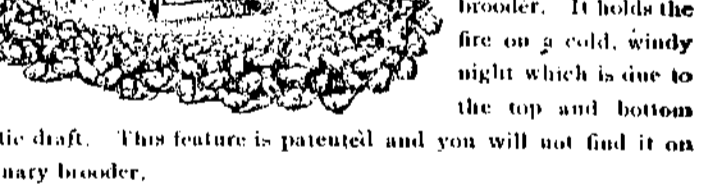

Oklahoma Man, Held as Slayer, Liberated by Confession of Murderer's Wife.

INDIAN, SENTENCED TO LIFE IMPRISONMENT IN 1900 FOR MURDER, FINDS HIMSELF WEALTHY AS HE STEPS INTO NEW WORLD.

Muskegon, Okla.—After serving 22 years in prison for a murder he did not commit, Charles Tidwell, of Welch, Okla., has returned home, probably a millionaire.

Recently a woman, Josie Gregory, made a startling confession, declaring that Tidwell was innocent and that her late husband, Robert Gregory, killed Brown, and that both of them, as well as her husband, were shot by Brown, a farmer, in Adams county, and was sentenced to life imprisonment.

Tidwell, who in 1900 was sentenced to life imprisonment for the murder of a woman, was found a different world when released. Twenty-two years ago he went to the federal prison at Atlanta, Ga., Oklahoma and Indian Territory still were the frontier.

Government allotments, held all these years, will now be paid to him, circles all over the world as the founder of the Tidwell colony, died in New York a few years ago.
