The news policy will be to give to the people of Hamptonton and vicinity an account of the happenings in this vicinity as they occur.

The editorial policy will be always favoring those things which are for the real good of our community. We are not controlled by any partisan faction, sect or organization.

There will be a column for correspondence and signed letters on topics of interest will be welcome. We shall try to cover the news of the town and we ask that lodges, clubs and other organizations send to us accounts of meetings and other activities which may interest the public.

Any suggestions for the improvement of this paper will be welcome at any time. Some we may be able to adopt, others we may not, but all will be most carefully considered.

Parking Rules Needed.

At the last meeting of Council, Peter Lucas suggested that a committee consisting of James Cottrell and Lino Rubba and a representative of the jitney men, act informally to secure information as to the views of interested parties on this subject.

Should parking be stopped absolutely on Bellevue avenue, or restricted to one hour? Should parking be stopped on one side of the cross streets, like Second, Central and Third?

Business Section Growing.

The development of Station Square, as the Varrier property between the railroad is now known, is one of the surprises of Hamptonton business life.

When in connection with an increase in the assessed value of property in the town of over \$100,000 last year this indicates that Hamptonton is growing.

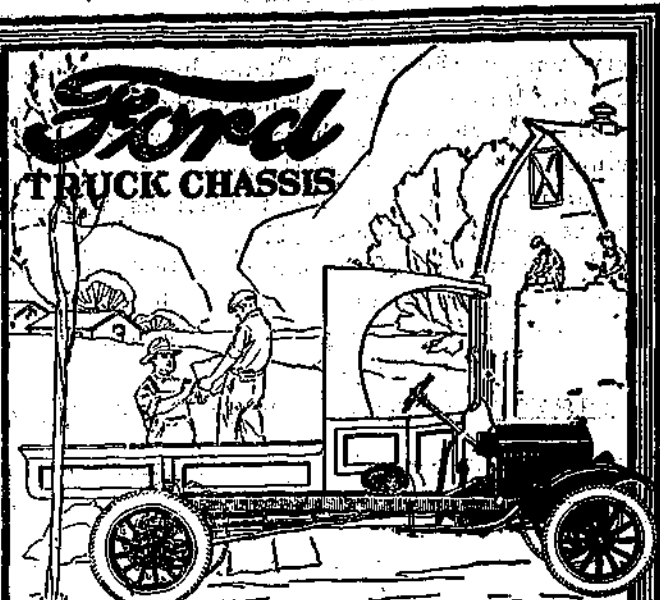

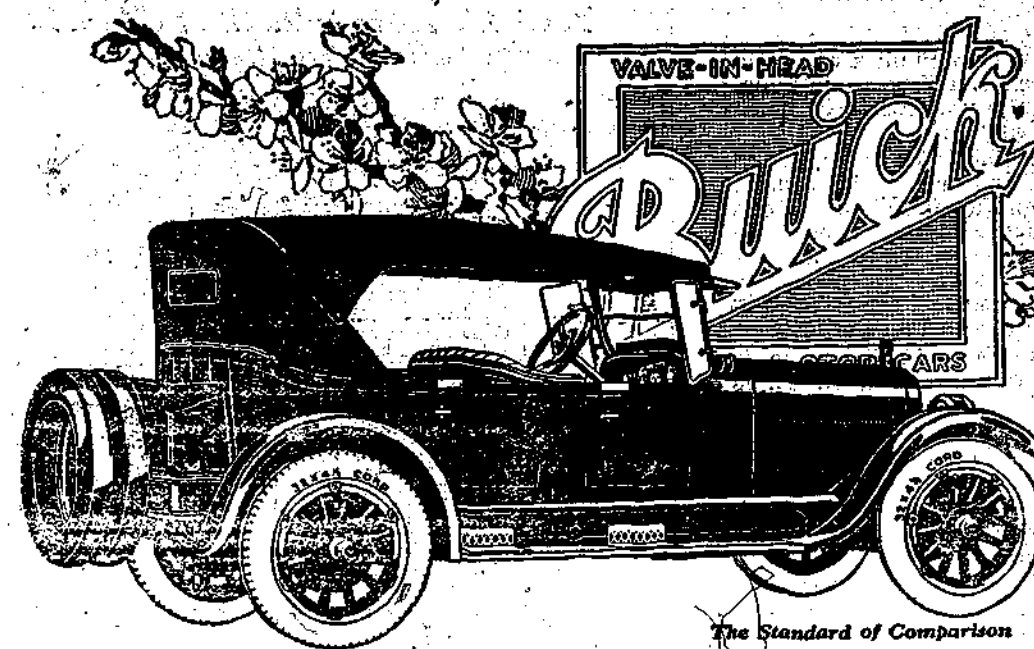

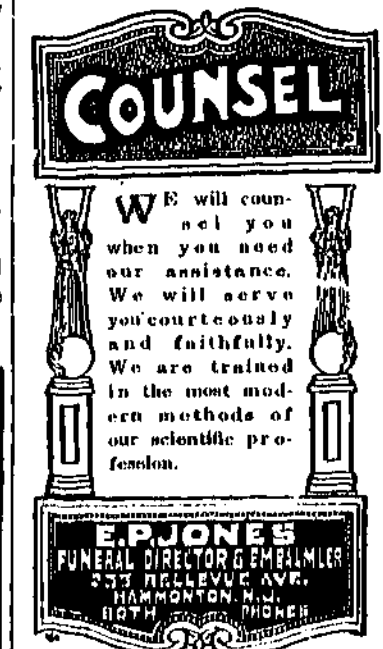
