Editorial Comment.

WATER COMMISSIONERS ON THE JOB.

The account of the meeting of the Water Commissioners given in our news columns shows that this body is doing much more than routine business. The report of the inspector shows a deplorable waste of water due to leaking fixtures.

CLEAN-UP WEEK

"Clean Up Week" will have the dates from May first to fifth this year. The Highway Committee of Town Council will provide teams to cart away rubbish.

Opponents of the proposed construction of bridges and roads connecting Atlantic City and Brigantine claim that this is a private real estate development being helped by public money.

Many County taxpayers are opposing the scheme alleging that it is being sponsored for the benefit of real estate interests who own large holdings at Brigantine and seek to have a necessary part of the development financed with funds from the County Treasury.

Judge J. J. White in an address before the Journalists Club opposed the spending of County money for the building up of what he referred to as "Bacharach Reach".

Proponents of the development point to a similar enterprise at Miami Beach, Florida. In this instance however millions of dollars of private capital were invested including the construction of the largest wooden bridge in the world by one of the developers Mr. John S. Collins of Moorestown, N. J., before the incorporation of the County was asked.

The sponsors also point to the additional increase in County rates, resulting in additional taxes for the County, should the project materialize.

The preliminary survey ordered by the Board of Freeholders does not mean that actual construction will be started now but it does pave the way for action later.

Experience in the past shows the wisdom of the people giving this subject careful consideration and registering their opinion with the Board of Freeholders before it is too late.

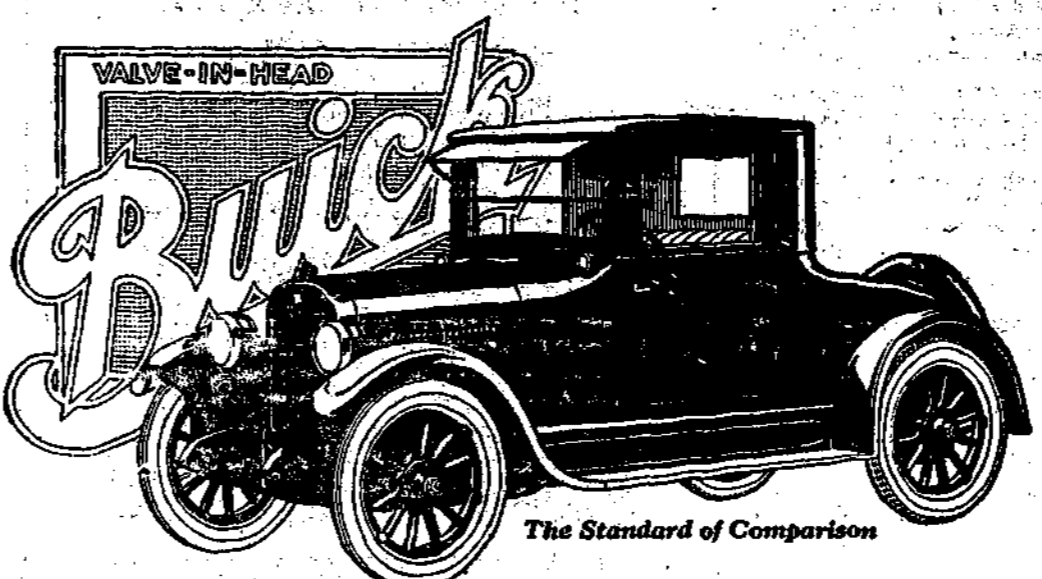

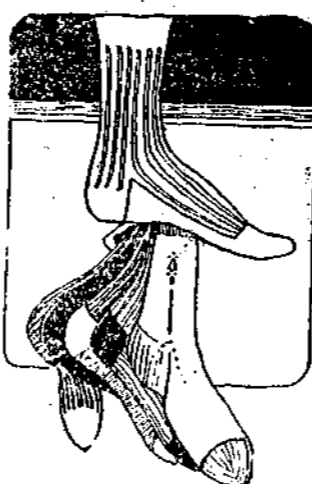
