Twilight games will be played every week, providing the fans turn out and lend support. If the crowds are large enough to warrant the expenses, an out-of-town team will play here.

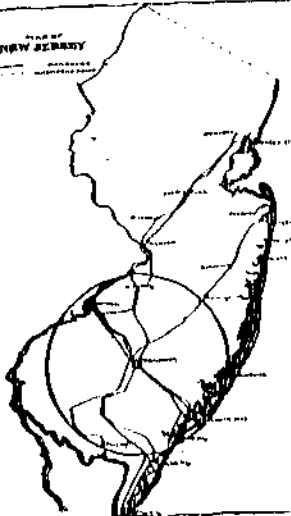
After one's work, in the cool of the day, a game is enjoyed by all. The same team will play next Wednesday evening, June 14th. Game called at 6.15.

### Hogs Inoculated.

The County Agent, in co-operation with the Atlantic Board of Agriculture and State Bureau of Animal Industry, is again carrying on a campaign to prevent hog cholera. The State Veterinarian will be in the county June 12, 13, and 14. No charge is made for the service of the Veterinarian, but each one pays for the amount of serum and virus used in inoculation.

Any one wishing to have their hogs inoculated should send their names with the number of hogs, and their approximate weight, that they wish to have inoculated, to Arthur R. Eldred, County Agent, May's Landing's Landing, N. J., by June 10. You will then receive a letter telling you on what day the Veterinarian will be at your place.
