## Special School Meeting.

As will be seen by posters, next week, the Board of Education have called a special school meeting for Friday, July 23rd, and we believe it should have all the publicity possible. At the annual meeting, the subject of a new building was introduced, and the Board instructed to call a special meeting, and to bring up data in regard to it. Accordingly, they make two propositions, which the voters should consider very carefully. Whether we should make additions to our present buildings, or erect a new High School building, is an important question.

We publish both propositions, and submit the question to the voters.

### PROPOSITION 1.

To authorize the Board of Education to erect an addition to the existing High School House, of non-fire proof construction, and in the rear of said High School House, and to purchase for said addition the school furniture and other necessary equipment.  
The cost of said addition, furniture and equipment shall not exceed the sum of Twenty Six Thousand Dollars. (\$26,000)  
The amount of money thought to be necessary for the foregoing is TWENTY SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS. (\$26,000)  
To authorize the Board of Education to borrow the money ordered to be raised by issuing bonds in the corporate name of the District in such amounts and payable at such times as the legal voters shall direct.

NOTICE is hereby further given that at said Special Meeting of the legal voters the following items of business to be acted on will be submitted:

### PROPOSITION 2.

To authorize the Board of Education to erect a New School House of fire proof construction on the Central School play ground, adjacent to the M. E. Church property and facing the School Park, and to purchase for said school house the school furniture and other necessary equipment. The cost of said school-house, furniture and equipment shall not exceed the sum of TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS. (\$256,500)  
The amount of money thought to be necessary for the foregoing is TWO HUNDRED FIFTY SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS. (\$256,500)  
To authorize the Board of Education to borrow the money ordered to be raised by issuing bonds in the corporate name of the District in such amounts and payable at such times as the legal voters shall direct.

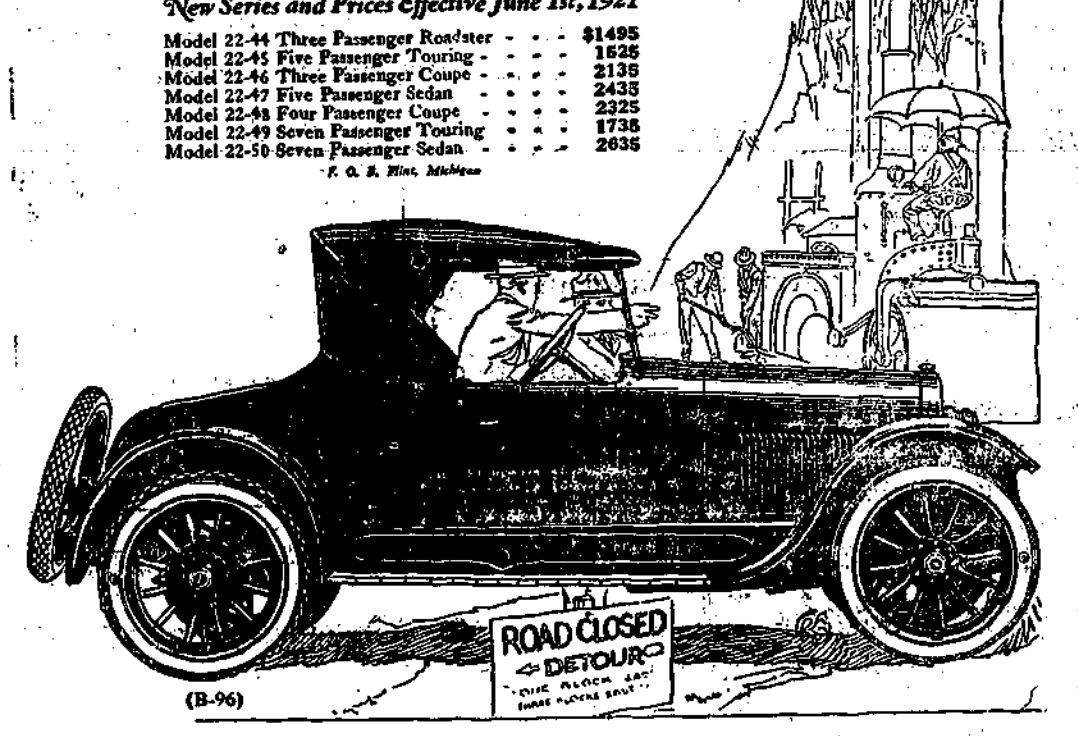

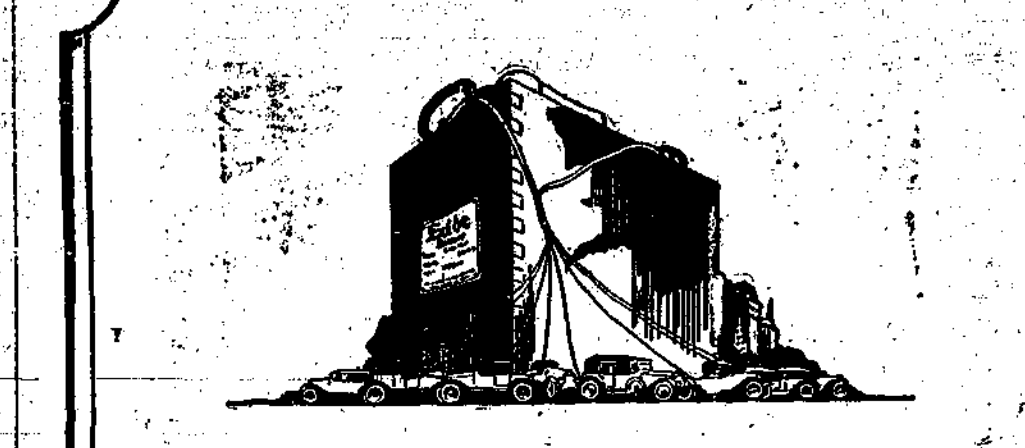

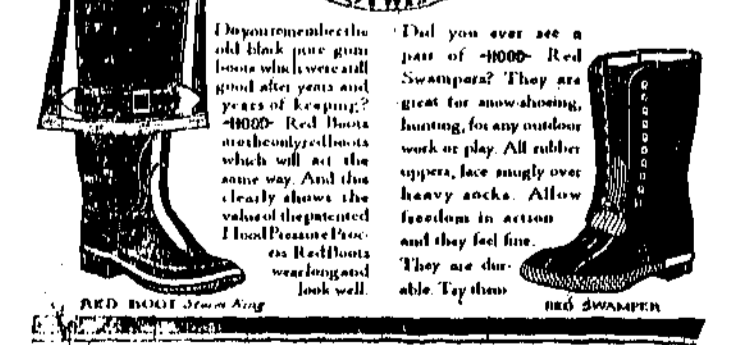
