### Indian's Idea of Man's Origin

Have the Pathmaker, making man from bits of clay, that did not take him long enough and he came out white, and secondly baked him out and he came out black, and thirdly baked him just right and he came out red, in the Croe Indians' explanation of the creation of the races and of man. This and 24 other Indian myths are contained in a collection of Indian lore recently compiled by Charles E. Brown, curator of the Wisconsin State Historical Museum.
