Columbus Day.

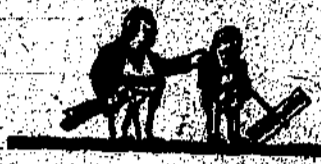
Wednesday, October 13th, will be a legal holiday in New Jersey, being the anniversary of Christopher Columbus.

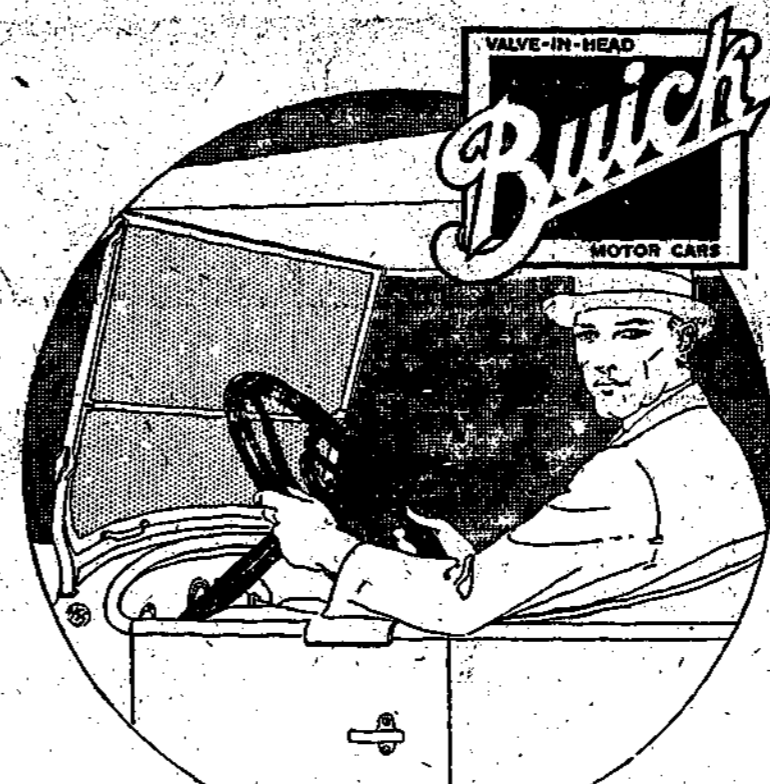

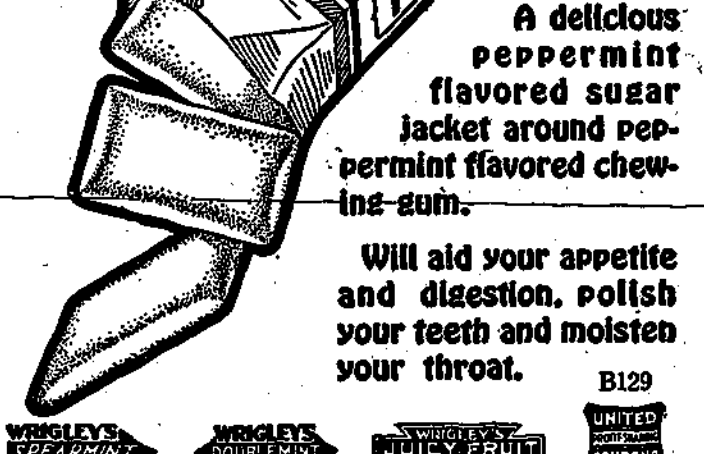
