### Four Alarms.

Up to yesterday noon, there were four fires this week.

The first, Monday evening, was the side chimney on Thos. Skaner's residence. There was no damage done.

The second, third and fourth, all on Thursday, were as follows:

During the noon hour, a house belonging to P. J. Heck, back of the Bellevue Garage, took fire on the roof, from a spark. It was quickly put out.

About three o'clock, the barn and sheds of Angelo Baglivo, on Plymouth Road, took fire and burned to the ground. With it went a newly-purchased horse, a lot of fodder and hay, wagon and tools. The house was saved, although the flames were dangerously near, with a high wind blowing. The case was made worse by dry walls, and no town water on that road.

That night, one of the clothing factories (Osgood building), was afire from an over-heated iron. It blazed for a time as though the men had an all-night job, but quick and intelligent service stopped the conflagration.

### Town Council.

The City Rulers met on Wednesday evening, all chairs being occupied but Mr. Jackson's.

Law and Order Committee reported a supposed "hold-up," the sending of Jas. Connors to May's landing; and a case of a family being beat up by a son-in-law named Ricco.

Clerk reported monies received for licenses, etc., amounting to \$50. Chief reported two minor fires during month.

Charles Baldi applied for a renewal of his pool-room license, in Red Men's building. Referred to committee.

A claim, properly vouched for, was received from E. F. Fry, for twenty-eight chickens killed by dogs. As there are on file several claims and more to come, the matter was referred to the new Council to investigate and see what can be done. At present, there being no tax, there are no funds available.

The commissioners appointed to investigate benefits and expenses of sewerage at Third and Fairview made their report, and Council set a date for a hearing of same.

Ordinance fixing the building line was passed third reading and adopted.

Resolution in regard to the collection of garbage was adopted, and date set for receipt of bids.

Mrs. Wm. B. Murphy died on Wednesday morning, after suffering several weeks from a stroke of paralysis. Mr. and Mrs. Murphy were esteemed by all who knew them, having been among the early residents here. A daughter, Mrs. Cora Hay, and two great grandchildren, Wm. and Phyllis Heath, have the sympathy of each one. Funeral service was held yesterday afternoon at St. Mark's Church.

### Pruning Demonstration.

All fruit growers who desire to obtain the latest information on pruning apple trees should attend the demonstration to be held on the farm of Charles Fitting, Pine Road, Thursday, December 22, at 1:30 p. m. The demonstration will be held unless there is a severe storm.

Mr. A. F. Mason, Extension Fruit Specialist of the State College of Agriculture will have charge of the meeting. Besides the pruning demonstration, Mr. Mason will gladly answer questions regarding fertilization and general orchard management. This meeting has been arranged by the County Agent Eldred by request of several of the fruit growers in Hammonton.
